However, I want to thank all the Block Captains and residents attending the meeting. We had a wonderful turn-out and a lively discussion related to the Neighborhood Watch Program. Based on the requests of those attending the meeting we have attached a listing of the Block Captains and their phone numbers as well as the sections/units assigned to each of them.

LANDSCAPING PHASE II

This spring, we will start our Landscaping Phase II. This will include the second entrance into Autumn Heights and most likely the area on the corner of Star Ranch Road and Broadmoor Bluffs. Depending on the bids and our budget for the project, Phase II may also include some of the areas that were cleared of junipers in our 2013 fire mitigation efforts. Please see the <u>Community Communication</u> <u>Boards</u> by each of the community mail boxes for copies of the plan.

The Board also has a list of approved shrubs, grasses and bushes that are part of the overall plan designed by Bill Guman. These plants were selected because they are drought resistant and require less water to get established than some other vegetation.

The complete listing is attached to the newsletter along with a Request for Approval Letter.

If you decide to plant a shrub or bush in the limited common area around your patio or replace a dead or dying plant you may select one of the options on the list of approved plants, and identify where you want to plant it. Email or send the letter to Kerry at Z&R and the Board will consider your request and respond to you in writing. Once approved, you have several options:

- a. You may purchase and plant the new bush or shrub (you will be responsible for any damage to electrical lines).
- b. You may purchase the shrub or grass and have Greener Grass plant it at your expense.

HOA monthly meetings: 3rd Monday of each month, 7:00 at the Clubhouse.
