Pool and Fitness Center Keys.....

The pool and fitness center have been rekeyed and most of the new keys have been issued. If you have not yet picked up your keys, please email Rosemarie at <u>rhallheyduk@yahoo.com</u>. If you are the owner of your unit, we ask that you provide identification when you pick up the key and if you are a renter, please have your owner fax the written authorization to Z & R that they received by mail in July. The next date scheduled for key distribution is: August 18 from 9:30 – 10:30 am at the Clubhouse.

Flooding......Several homes were flooded as a result of the rain we had on Monday July 30th The problems were multiple, including gutter and downspout issues, insufficient grading and erosion of sand and soil from previous rainstorms as well as water coming off Star Ranch Road. The Board and Z&R are working closely with contractors to rectify the problems.

.....Update on Painting......

Three additional buildings, 4070, 4090 and 4120 have been painted and contribute to the community's improved look. This will leave 13 buildings to be painted and 13 buildings plus the clubhouse completed. The Board is considering several options regarding this process. We started in 2010 and initial plans were to complete the precess over several years. Based on the request of a number of homeowners, the Board then considered a loan to complete the painting all at once and left few stones unturned. However, due to the economy and federal loan guidelines, it has been impossible to secure a loan. Other options under consideration include continuing the process building by building with a possible completion date several years down the road or a special assessment to complete the painting project in 2013. - 3. Keep your garage doors closed when not in use.
- 4. Clean up any spilled grease or food from patio bar-b-ques after use.
- 5. Do not leave your pets unattended outside of your home.
